1. GERTIE & GIDGET, THE GIRAFFES
Palm fiber has been carefully stained with
spots to create this loveable pair mama giraffe
is fourteen-foot tall. Her life-sized lovable
newborn mini me will delight you at six feet tall!

2. SWEET CAROLINE, THE BUTTERFLY
A tribute to Monarchs everywhere, the fivefoot high butterfly can be seen day and
night. Thanks to the Flamethrower coleus
with copper coleus added for definition,
palm fiber creates intricate patterns
on both sides of her six-foot wingspan.
Outlined in sparkling solar fairy lights.

3. GATEWAY TO GREENWOOD

This is the perfect spot to snap that group photo. Covered in creeping ficus, the inside is accented by variegated creeping ficus with twinkling fairy lights overhead to light the night. Verbena spills down the walls in shades of purple, pink and lavender while coleus wrap their petals around the base in shades of pink and black. Red and white begonias erupt in mounds of flowers. Swirls of color from the calibrachoa. Emerald and Silver Falls dichondra dangle overhead. Red rooster carex, and variegated potato vine cover the top of the Gateway.

4. MILKSHAKE, THE COW

This well-mannered cow has a lovely coat of variegated creeping fig with spots of chocolate chip ajuga. Her cowbell is held by a burlap collar while she waits patiently for you to join her in a field of Shasta daisies. Her nearby sign made of creeping fig reminds you to "eat mor chiken." 5. ANNIVERSARY CAKE

Celebrating 75 Years of Camp Fellowship

What better way to celebrate the 75th Anniversary of Camp Fellowship than with a four-foot-tall by six-foot-wide, three-tiered cake! This cake is festively "iced" with creeping fig, creeping jenny, calibrachoa and verbena. Sponsored by Fellowship Camp & Conference Center

6. STANLEY, THE STORK

Standing 4-foot-tall Stanley is proud of his new delivery. His plumage of white polka dot plant is accented with Dragon's tongue along his strong wings.

7. HARLEY, THE LABRADOR

Ready to play with his palm fiber ball, our three-foot high Lab is six feet long from nose to tail, with Dragon's Tongue on the body and chocolate chip ajuga punctuating his muzzle and paws.

8. GAMECOCK

He's a fireball ready for action! Twelve feet tall and covered in red alternanthera, with a tail tipped in dragon's blood sedum & Spanish moss. "Fancy feathers black" coleus is used to provide depth to the top feathers, this topiary is a true replica of USC's beloved "Fighting Gamecock." Who wouldn't be cocky in a vibrant field of chocolate drop & flamethrower coleus, purple potato vines & red petunias. Sponsored by E. A. Sween Company

9. LANDER BEARCAT

With massive jaws and mighty paws, the Lander University Bearcat proudly towers over you at eleven feet tall and six feet wide. Creeping variegated fig, with true yellow alternanthera, create a velvety fur of chartreuse. Delightful wire vine highlights his face. Lander University designed its stylish blue jersey. 9 & 19. THE DABBLING DUCKS

(two locations)

Our delightful ducks playing beside the water are covered with leptinella and sedum on their backs & low growing Turkish sedum on their wings. The males have lichen feet and bellies to impress their female companions, while the females' spanish moss give them a lively appeal. The yellow duck is Fancy Finch ajuga.

10 & 24. THE PLAYFUL PANDA FAMILY (two locations)

These iconic bears from China are big eaters, spending 12 hours a day consuming bamboo. This year they are dressed up in Spanish moss for the Festival!

11. BUBBLES, THE SEAHORSE

The graceful seahorse seems to be floating quietly along, content to gather admiration for the explosion of colors and textures created by beautiful succulents and club moss on its four-foot-tall body. Sponsored by Citizens Trust Company

12. FLORA, THE FLAMINGO

This four-foot wading bird is ready to strut its stuff for all to admire. Pink and red earth star bromeliads cover this elegant topiary while its two-foot long stylishly curved body & neck is supported on two legs of palm fiber.

13. GRRRRR KASASA, THE TIGER

Beware the fourteen-foot-tall, seventeen-foot-long, ferocious tiger sculpted of orange palm fiber. He proudly guards a waterfall of weeping love grass and emerald falls dichondra, this topiary is inspired by one of R. Thornwell Dunlap, Jr.'s favorite sculptures. Surrounding the Tiger is a meadow of rex begonias, moonstone ice plant, moss roses, flamethrower coleus, wire vine, and various tradescantias. Sponsored by Countybank

14. BRINGING LIGHT TO LIFE PAVILION

You'll have it made in the shade when you stop to visit one of the Festival's most dynamic creations – an arching copper topped pavilion covered with English ivy and a variety of colorful verbena! 15. WHEN PIGS FLY

That's right pigs fly in Greenwood at the SC Festival of Flowers! Barbie-Q is quite the ham, she will love posing with you for photos! Covered in creeping fig, her piggy ears are dressed up with pink polka dot plant. Her snout is echeveria. Sponsored by Connie Maxwell Children's Ministries

16. SMILE, PHOTO OP

This double-sided, creeping fig photo op boasts face-framing hats and hair made of Prairie fire, weeping love grass, autumn fern and Spanish moss. The back reminds you to SMILE big in palm fiber before you put your head in.

17. THE JELLYFISH

Don't be shocked by these floating friends!
Jellyfish are made from a multitude of succulents that create their luminous bodies and trailing tentacles.

18. JEEP WRANGLER

This custom-built, 4/5th scale jeep is exactly what you need on your topiary safari. An "annual" favorite, the jeep sports an exterior of lemon ball, and Turkish sedums. Creeping fig, chocolate creeping jenny, chocolate chip ajuga, clubmoss, and palm fiber create a cool interior. Creeping fig covers the grill and roof, while the customized red, yellow, white alternanthera, flamethrower and copper coleus, on the hood finishes it off.

19. REEVES, THE MERMAID

Locks of burro's tail & silver falls dichondra frame a friendly face of lichen. Her body is covered in lichen while an enchanting pattern of succulents, white alternanthera, earth stars and variegated water celery trail down her graceful tail. A top of red alternanthera with a matching belt.

19. STENNOLISSA, THE DOLPHIN

The whimsical bottlenose dolphin seems caught in action, spouting water as it leaps four feet high in the air. Green creeping fig creates a sleek definition for our friendly dolphin.

This 6-foot-tall ape comes to life with a vibrant coat of red ruby alternanthera and accents of palm fiber.

22. EMMETT, THE CITADEL BULLDOG

23. PETE, THE PEACOCK

Making his debut this year! This proud bird is ready to flaunt his stuff. Standing 5' tall his proud neck is covered in feathers fashioned out of palm fiber. His 6' wide tail feathers are planted with berry mix verbena.

25. MILAK, THE MAMA ELEPHANT

Standing tall in a field of captivating flowers, Milak's body is covered with creeping fig. Ears filled with soft Spanish moss highlight her massive twelve-foot height. Her colorful headdress adds a visual punch filled with succulents, walking iris, coleus, and alternanthera. Mama's blanket is an eye-catching collage of sedums, yellow & red alternantheras, mazus reptans, begonias, Ghost plants, and ajuga. 26. HORTON, THE BABY ELEPHANT

27. ARI, THE LION

The king of the jungle is truly regal, with a massive mane of prairie fire carex. His face is accented with lemon ball and Irish moss on his chin. Creeping fig creates a sleek coat for the lion's 4 by 6 foot high body. Sponsored by Greenwood Commissioners of Public Works

27. JIBARI, THE LION CUB

You can tell this two-foot-tall baby is just waiting to be king. Three feet long, his body is completely made of creeping fig, with palm fiber ears, nose and tail just like dad.

At six-feet tall, T-Rex will awe both children and adults. Covering the king of the dinosaurs is creeping fig. A mouth full of red bromeliad gives him a menacing smile. A mountain of topsy turvy echeveria, ogon, and African spear plant, and an array of diverse succulents cover his back. Around his regal neck a wreath of begonias, variegated ice plant, and Pink poodle coleus.
